This bill begins to deconstruct any use of any rifle/gun protected by the 14th amendment of the US Constitution, the one that also requires all persons, and was a civil rights bill for the right of all citizens to the full extent of the rule of the land. All people means Caucasians, Blacks, Asians, Hispanic/Latino, Native Americans.

So looking at how this deconstructs the 14th amendment: Each of these from rounds of 10 max or bump stocks are well demonstrated by California judges to be unconstitutional by reason of 'everything' on a gun can be considered an accessory which is anything including the trigger. Now a bump stock is an accessory meant specifically for disabled people who have/can use a gun/rifle but require the assistance of a bump stock. So by eliminating this as well as other 'accessories' including magazine limits, removes the ability of an entire class of people from using their constitutional rights to own, operate, and use a firearm.
