This bill would destroy agriculture and forestry in Hood River County. The bill would allow Hood River's farm and forest land to be paved over without any of the safeguards contained in the carefully crafted and and nurtured land use system that has made Oregon special. It is a devastating proposal, and I urge you to stop it.
