Dear Oregon Legislature,

Please accept this letter in strong support for Senate Bill 210, which seeks to enhance the integrity of our electoral process by prioritizing in-person voting and implementing stricter identification requirements.

Oregon elections and those who manage them are fraught with discrepancies, outright fraud with very limited transparency. In just the last 5 years, over one thousand voters were found registered in Oregon and the Secretary of State was forced to resign in disgrace without facing personal accountability. Elections in Oregon appear highly suspicious. The voter identity fraud may likely be much greater than currently reported.

Most recently, voter ballot drop boxes came under terrorist attacks exposing the vulnerability of mail-in voting to fraud, intimidation and coercion. In October 2024, ballot drop boxes in Portland, Oregon, and Vancouver, Washington, were attacked in cases of domestic terrorism. Explosive device materials were found at the scene. Terrorist(s) manufactured explosive devices, likely in this community, in an effort to silence and disenfranchise American citizens. These attacks jeopardize the security of ballots but also destroy public confidence in the election process and those who "oversee" the results.

The chain of custody for mail-in ballots remains a critical issue and obviously intentional weak-link to be easily exploited. The 2024 terrorist attacks against chain-of-custody in the most recent election in Portland and Vancouver highlight this scheme. Breaks in the chain of custody create opportunities for tampering and fraud, as highlighted by the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA). Proper documentation and secure handling are essential to maintaining the integrity of ballots.

Senate Bill 210 addresses these concerns by emphasizing in-person voting, which reduces the risks associated with mail-in ballots and drop boxes. It also ensures that voters present valid identification, further safeguarding against fraud.

I urge you to support SB210 to protect the integrity of our elections and restore public trust in the democratic process.
