## I urge you to vote "No" on SB 210 and to not pass it out of committee.

I am a long-time PCP with the Marion County Democratic Central Committee. I have been active in our Neighborhood Leader Program which educates people about upcoming elections and the voting process. I have gone door-to-door for several years and can tell you that the vast majority of Oregonians love vote-by-mail.

**Oregonians voted for vote-by-mail (M. 60) in 1998 and passed it 69.4% to 30.6%!** Our state has the 5<sup>th</sup> highest voter turnout in the United States! Why is this even being heard?

I am against this bill also because:

- It makes it very difficult for people who have disabilities or are homebound to vote or even to get a vote-by-mail ballot. My 98 year old neighbor votes in every election.
