To the Senate Rules Committee,

I am writing in strong opposition to SB 210, which proposes to repeal Oregon's vote-by-mail system.

Oregon has been a national leader in vote-by-mail for over two decades, providing secure, efficient, and accessible elections for all eligible voters. Our system increases voter participation, reduces costs, and ensures a paper trail for election integrity. There is no credible evidence of widespread fraud in our vote-by-mail process.

Repealing this system would needlessly disenfranchise voters—particularly seniors, people with disabilities, rural residents, and working families—and undermine public trust in our democratic institutions. Rather than dismantling a process that works, the Legislature should be focused on preserving and improving voter access.

I urge you to reject SB 210 and stand up for voting rights in Oregon.
