I am have lived in Oregon since before mail-in voting was used.

Oregon decided to experiment and "lead the nation" with a new mail-in system. many were skeptical at that time. The pushers of the plan promised they would purge the voter rolls as many were concerned over people moving, dying, and many reason why the voter rolls drift from hopefully accurate to inaccurate.
