Re: HB 2647, -3 - Oppose

Chair Marsh, Vice-Chair Andersen, Vice-Chair Breese-Iverson, and members of the Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on HB 2647, as modified by the -3 amendment.

Central Oregon LandWatch is a land use and conservation advocacy organization that has proudly protected Central Oregon's forests, high deserts, rivers, wildlife, and vibrant communities for more than 35 years. The membership of Central Oregon LandWatch consists of farmers, ranchers, environmentalists, hunters, anglers, housing advocates, and community leaders. Our members share the belief that Oregon's land use system is fundamental to what makes this state such a special place to live.

The -3 amendment would facilitate an urban growth boundary (UGB) amendment specific to the City of Monmouth. LandWatch opposes this UGB amendment on procedural grounds. Oregon has a well-established process for amending UGBs, guided by Goal 14 of the statewide land use planning system, and that is based on need for land to accommodate forecast population growth. This process requires the consideration of alternative UGB boundary locations and also ensures full public participation throughout the process. Existing state law, at OAR 660-024-0070, also allows for UGB "swaps" that would facilitate what appear to be goals of the -3's proponents. The -3 amendment here would sidestep all this process and allow the legislature to determine the location of the Monmouth UGB by fiat. Doing so would unnecessarily sidestep Oregon land use law to give special treatment to one of Oregon's 241 incorporated cities.

The substance of the proposed UGB amendment in the -3 bill may have merit, but that is for the existing UGB amendment process to determine. LandWatch opposes HB 2647 and the -3 amendment and we respectfully request this Committee not pass HB 2647 out of committee.
