I oppose SB 210 because it is an unwanted useless change to accessible voting for all Oregonians. Many Oregonians work hourly jobs and live paycheck to paycheck. The working class is most impacted by laws like these that restrict access and options to government involvement. Voting in person on election day will make civic involvement a risk to everyday citizens employment, housing and ability to support their families.

This would also reduce access for rural, low income, elderly and underserved of Oregon. These populations often have limited access to travel and are dependent on owning or knowing someone who owns a personal vehicle, specifically mass transit is not available in most rural areas.

The process is secure through the USPS with safeguards like signature matching and ballot tracking. These measures ensure that every vote is legitimate and accounted for.
