RE: Opposition to House Bill 3374

Dear Committee Members,

I wish to express my strong opposition to SAIF's attempt to reorganize into a "Managed Care Organization (MCO)."

The primary goal of an MCO is to:

- 1. Improve the quality of care.
- 2. Control costs

SAIF's proposed "closed panel" MCO will not improve the quality of care.

In fact, continuing to limit the number of physicians and PHYSICIAN TYPES who can treat injured workers on its MCO panel will have the opposite effect.
Continued closed paneled MCOs will further discriminate against injured workers in Oregon.

SAIF has not established a need to control costs by further limiting care to injured workers.

Oregon already ranks a low 22nd in average W/C costs per state (out of 50 states plus District of Columbia). Yet, Oregon is only 25th in benefits paid out, only 37th in cash benefits paid out and only <u>32nd in total benefits paid out</u>! Oregon already has one of the "least expensive/most profitable" work comp systems in the U.S.

Don't further discriminate against injured Oregon workers. Vote no on HB 3374
