Verifying a voter's identity is achievable in many ways. In person voting disenfranchises limited and non-ambulatory elderly, people who work during poll hours, or people whose work environment does not allow the freedom to reach polls during hours open.

I have used vote by mail and unattended ballot drop off. I do not see the necessity of presenting credentials at a physical polling place.

This bill presumes fraud has occurred in Oregon elections. According to audits, very few incidences of voter fraud have occurred.

Vote by mail seems the most progressive way to enfranchise all legal voters. Now that the DMV has addressed the problem of non citizens registering to vote, this issue is moot, and only crafted to sway votes to one party.
