**Concealed Carry Provisions** 

SB 698 is proposing changes to Oregon Revised Statutes regarding where concealed carry is permitted or may be prohibited. Allowing any city, county or district to adopt policies to prohibit concealed carry will create a state-wide nightmare. As November of 2024, Oregon has 327,858 concealed carry permit holders. Twenty-nine states have adopted Constitutional Carry for their entire state, meaning that a permit is no longer required. As you can see in Figure 1 of the report (see above), as the number of concealed carry rose, crime decreased. Concealed carry holders are by far the most law abiding of the population.

If SB 698 passes it will embolden criminals and result in more deaths and crime due to the restrictive requirements resulting in fewer people having the ability to defend themselves. What with criminals, gangs, Mexican cartels and the deranged who walk our streets and invade our homes it is imperative that we remain protected at all times.
