I offer this testimony in support of Senate Bill 210. Recently, at an Oxford University Debate, former House Speaker Nancy Pelosi contended that there were election irregularities in the 2016 presidential election where Donald J. Trump was elected to the presidency. Others have cast doubt on the 2020 presidential election where Joe Biden was elected to the presidency. While the focus in both 2016 and 2302 were on presidential elections, doubt was subsequently cast over numerous at other levels of government.

While not every voter can cast their ballot in this way, this traditional method of voting should once again be the primary method of voting in the State of Oregon and everywhere else. For this reason, I urge you to vote in favor of SB210. Thank you.
