Both Democrats and Republicans in Oregon usually agree that voting by mail is far better than requiring in-person voting. Reasons for voting by mail include the ability to thoughtfully choose candidates and issues without rush, and the ability to vote at any time and location of convenience. Voting fraud is not higher when voting by mail; this argument is often used but bears no weight of evidence. Restricting Oregon to only in-person voting on a single day serves no purpose other than to restrict voting rights, and is therefore anti-American and undemocratic.
