SUBJECT: Oppose SB 210 – Makes in person voting on the date of an election the standard method for conducting an election

Dear Chair Jama, Vice Chair Bonham, and Members of the Committee,

I strongly oppose SB210.

For decades, Oregon's vote-by-mail system has operated safely with negligible incidences of fraudulent votes cast. It supports voting access for our voters who have real challenges with same day voting, such as working people who cannot take the day off to stand in line to vote, people with disabilities, seniors, parents who are caring for young children, citizens caring for elderly parents or relatives, citizens who lack transportation to polling sites, etc.

To disenfranchise thousands of voters for the purpose of eliminating a statistically insignificant occurrence of voter fraud is antidemocratic and anti-American!

With our current vote-by-mail system we assure that all registered voters' voices are heard.

I urge you to oppose SB 210 and to continue supporting policies that make voting as accessible and equitable as possible for all citizens.
