Oregon has conducted all elections by mail since 2000, making it a leader in vote-by-mail systems. Here are some key statistics on Oregon's vote-by-mail process:

- 1. Voter Turnout: Oregon consistently has one of the highest voter turnout rates in the U.S. In the 2020 presidential election, 75.3% of eligible voters participated.
- 2. Ballot Return Rates: In the 2022 midterms, about 1.9 million ballots were cast, with a turnout of 61.5% of registered voters.
- 3. Fraud Rates: Oregon's vote-by-mail system has been highly secure, with only about a dozen cases of voter fraud out of over 100 million ballots cast since its implementation.
- 4. Ballot Rejection: The state's rejection rate for ballots due to signature mismatches or missing signatures is typically less than 1%.
