I strongly oppose SB 210. This bill represents a significant decrease in voter accessibility in Oregon and thus is a threat to the democratic process that America stands for. Our state's vote-by-mail system is proven to be a safe and fair process. Despite what some may say regarding election fraud, there is no evidence this is a threat.
