I strongly support Oregon's mail-in voting system and strongly oppose wasting taxpayers' time and money on efforts to get rid of it.

My husband and I moved to Oregon with our young children in 2007, primarily to be close to family who had settled here. Prior to moving to Oregon, I had voted in Iowa, Connecticut, and Massachusetts using in-person systems. It was always somewhat fun to go to the polling stations (usually at a local school) and I loved taking my young daughter with me. It was also a pain to schedule, and the lines were often quite long, and the weather miserable.
