I am in support of SB210.

There is too much evidence of either fraud or mismanagement in the vote-by-mail process and in the management of voter rolls. There are votes from individuals providing addresses where they do not live, votes from addresses that do not exist, votes from deceased individuals, votes from non-citizens, votes from individuals who are not old enough to vote, and votes where signatures do not match.

The State of Oregon is being sued by Judicial Watch due to the state of the voter roles.

The vote is the most sacred and precious element of our system. Each eligible individuals vote must count and must not be cancelled, lost or stalled due to fraud or mismanagement. We are advised to not send cash through the mail and each vote should be considered as worth 1000 dollars and treated with the security required.

In person same day voting ensures that each eligible vote is counted.

I support the provisions for absentee ballots for people that are unable to make it to the polls on election day.

Increased scrutiny must be over those absentee ballots and as there should be a substantial reduction in the number of these types of ballots that scrutiny should be feasible.

This is not a partisan issue. It is a requirement for honesty, accountability and integrity in our voting process.
