I support HB 210 - eliminating mail-in ballots and requiring in-person voting on Election Day, with an ID validating citizenship.

In addition, I suggest a roll book > signing your name by your address, so that only you or other actual residents can claim that location. This should be done in the precincts. Many of us are willing to volunteer to assist.

During the 2022 Election, a friend and I observed the Lake Oswego City Hall Election Box. Shortly after 7:15 pm, we were shocked to see an individual with a Washington license plate (verified residence) pull up to the Dropbox and for 10 minutes stuffed ballots in the box. When the line behind him grew long, he pulled over and waited. Then he drove around again and began stuffing more ballots in the box. Now, I don't know which side he was stuffing for, but I think both sides should be concerned. Is this fair for an out-of-state person to be bringing 'who knows what' ballots to our box? I think not. Were all of these ballots legitimate? Questionable.

- There is no accountability as cameras are not required in Oregon, as they are in other States.
- Ballot harvesting is allowed, so that again, negates accountability.
- The second Dropbox in Lake Oswego was way down a lonely lane, where any cheating could occur. Thankfully, I noticed it was moved to a more observable spot, in the last election.
- There has only been one party in charge of Oregon since mail-in ballots went into play in the 1980's. This raises suspicions.
- Checking someone's signatures from a computer at the elections office, by a person who is not comparing it to the voter's license signature, in person, leaves room for error.
- Without the cancellation of a mail-in stamp, votes can be counted for days after election day as they have been. This leaves room for cheating.
- Election Day could be a holiday to allow for in-person voting.
- There is more, but I hope the above is a consideration. We really need fair elections.
