Vote by mail is cost-effective, not only for the government (state and local), but also for the citizens of the state. I remember the days of getting off work, figuring out childcare and dinner, then hustling to my polling place to stand in line to cast my vote before the poll closed. Per the Secretary of State's website:

"Is voter fraud a problem in Oregon?

No. Oregon elections are secure and protected against voter fraud in all but exceedingly rare instances.

A review of the vote by mail system by the state's Legislative Fiscal Office found from 2000-2019 there were

approximately 61 million ballots cast. Of those, 38 criminal convictions of voter fraud were obtained.

This amounts to a .00006% rate."

Voter fraud is NOT been a problem in Oregon.

I strongly urge a NO vote on this bill.
