

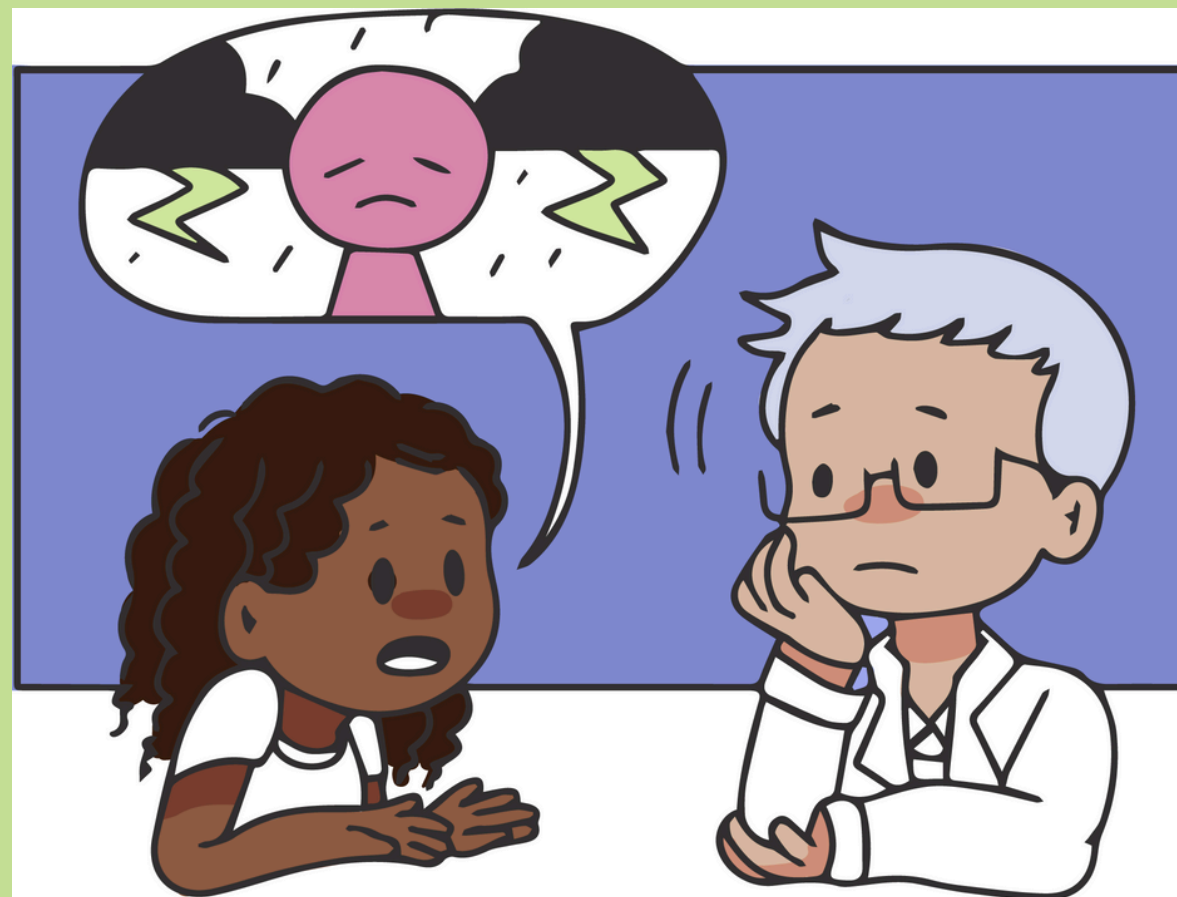

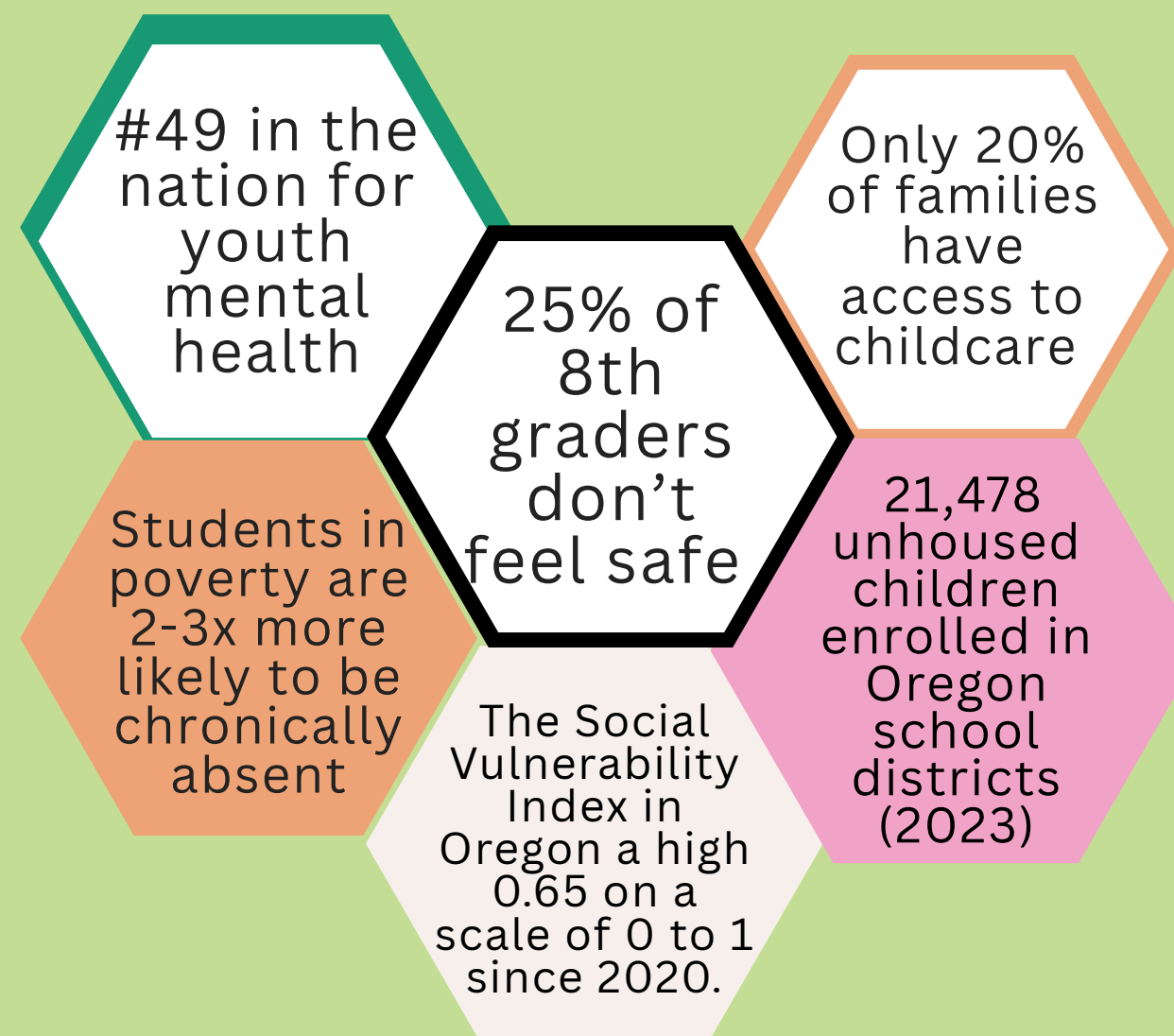

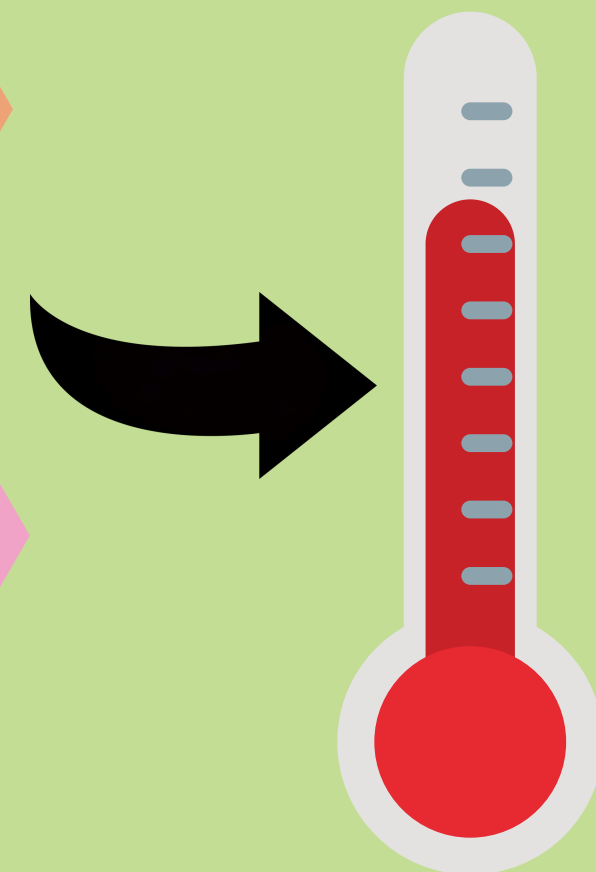

Root Causes

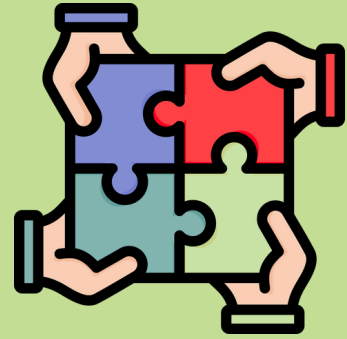


Chronic absenteeism rates in the bottom 20% of states

Full Service Community Schools: Community-Driven Collaboration for Student and Family Success



Community Schools are public schools that coordinate and integrate cradle to career educational, developmental, family, health and other comprehensive services through community-based organizations and public / private partnerships.



Access to services are available in the school to students, families and the community, including before, during and after school hours, on weekends and over the summer.



Each Community School looks different, depending on the assets and needs of the school and surrounding community. Each Community School adopts different structures and practices, while using the common six pillar framework.

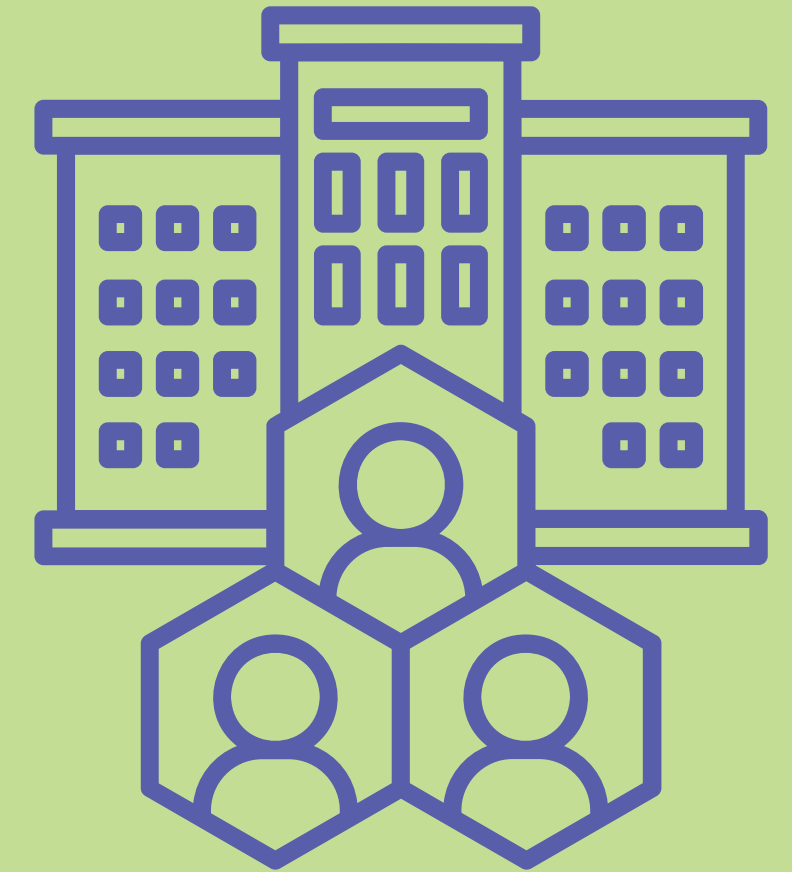
Infrastructure Taking Shape

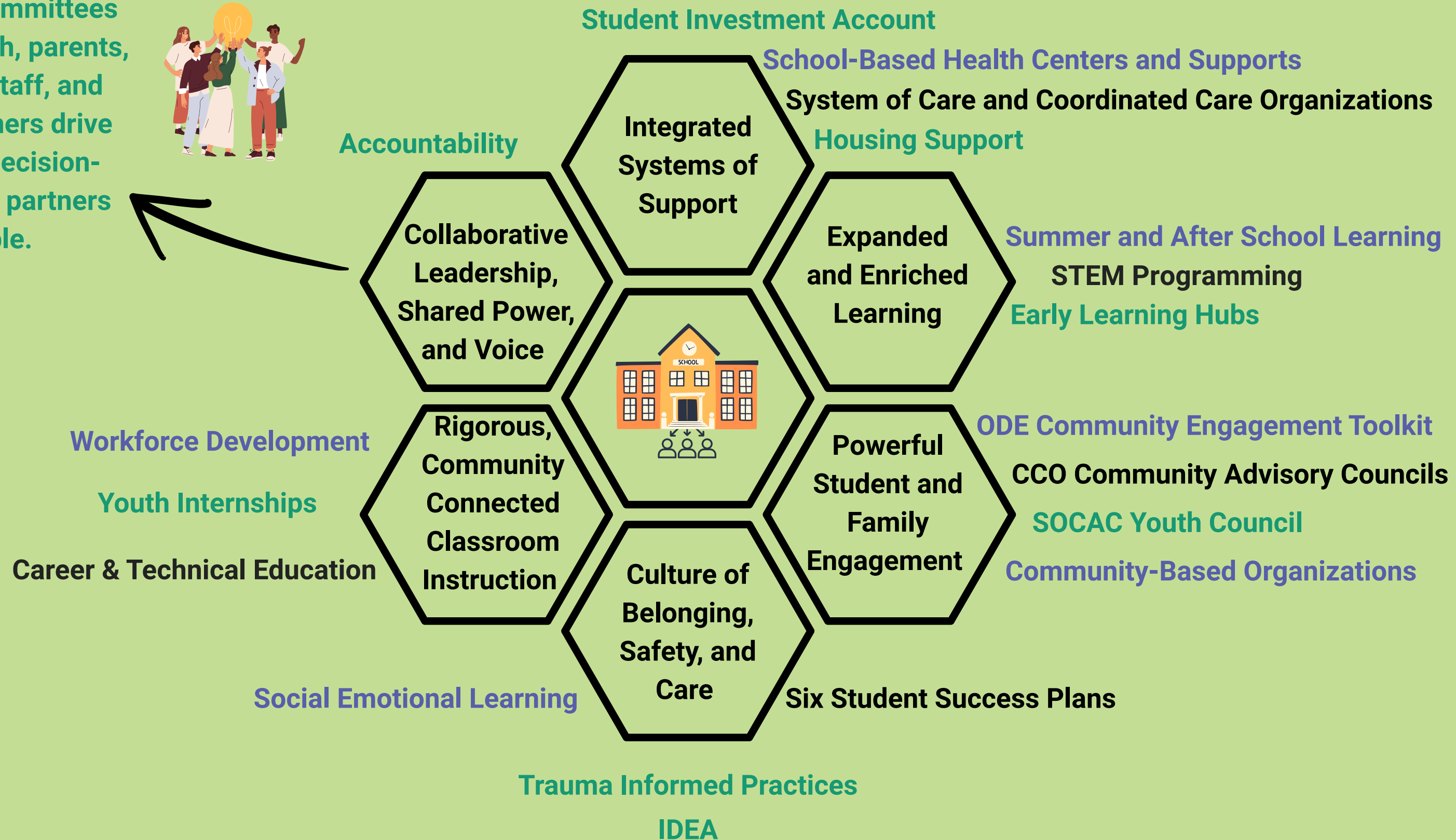
