Mail-in voting allows constituents ample time to review candidates' positions and make and informed decisions in the best interest of the city, state and country. Mail-in voting also allows constituents to participate in the election process despite lacking consistent or reliable transportation (i.e.- no access to public transit due to distance, disability or safety issues; financial constraints limiting access to rideshare; no access to a personal vehicle) and those living in rural areas with limited options for public polling. Removing the ability to vote by mail disenfranchises a significant proportion of the population whose voices need to be heard.
