My name is Amanda Graber and I am a registered voter in Clackamas County. I strongly oppose SB 210, which would make in-person voting on election day the standard method of voting in Oregon. I am proud to be an Oregonian when it comes time to vote because of our mail-in voting system. This system makes voting accessible to all voters instead of adding barriers that may disenfranchise some. As a teacher, mail-in voting allows me to cast my vote without missing a day of work to stand in lines.
