Mail-in voting has increased participation and made voting more accessible for people with fulltime jobs, disabilities, kids, or who live in areas further away from polling locations. The idea of requiring in-person voting and only on one day is an attempt at mass disenfranchisement and contrary to the ideals of democratic participation. Election day is also not a federal or state holiday meaning that most people who work full-time will have a very narrow window to participate. This measure is an attempt to narrow the electorate by those who wish to rig elections in favor of candidates who appeal to wealthy or retired able-bodied constituents who can and will dominate polling locations in that narrow window of time.
