I absolutely support In-Person voting, requiring Voter ID confirming citizenship, generally doing away with mail-in voting and restoring election integrity in Oregon.

As a lifelong Oregon resident and voter, I am constantly worried about our election process. I often worry that my vote may not count, or the validation process may have problems. If I appear in person, show my ID, and cast my vote - then there is no doubt that I was the person that cast my vote. Currently a little over half of registered Oregon voters even vote, which leaves the unused ballots ripe for harvesting fraudulently to sway the elections in the current mail-in method. With very little data a person can request and print their own ballot at home for a person who has not voted. This process can be automated by technology or swamped by groups that have special interests.

Our Oregon elections are NOT secure, and the Oregon DMV issues that have caused many ineligible voters to be registered as voters does not sit well with me.

We need voter integrity in Oregon. I would even be ok with a provision allowing for 2-3 days of in-person voting leading up to and including election day, to provide some flexibility.

Mail in voting is NOT secure. I consider anyone in favor of keeping the mail-in voting to be in favor of election fraud, anyone opposing in-person also in favor of election fraud.
