Our current system is not only secure but also convenient and accessible. Voters are already identified and registered through the DMV at the time of licensure, ensuring that the integrity of our voter rolls is maintained. Forcing voters to return to in-person voting as the standard method would disproportionately impact those who are elderly, disabled, or living in rural areas, and would create barriers for many citizens who rely on the convenience of voting by mail.
