SB 210 Public Hearing - Makes in-person voting on the date of an election the standard method for conducting an election. **OPPOSE**

I strongly suggest we NOT change to IN-PERSON VOTING for several valid reasons listed below.

OREGON MAIL IN VOTING IS THE MOST SECURE & THE BEST WAY TO CONTROL FRAUDULENT VOTING while also ELIMINATING the ability to SELECTIVELY DENY GROUPS OF ENTITLED VOTERS to have their vote COUNTED!!

- If the voter does not reside at the location they are registered at, THEY DON'T GET A FRADULENT BALLOT, not 1, not 2, not 25 ballots with tricks and schemes.
- 2) Yes in states that allow last minute registration, DAY OF VOTING (as several LARGE states currently do) and some don't even require **authentic** id, just a on-the-spot signature (any signature, or scribble) with weak or no ID to back-up the person is actually are who they say they are, living at a specific address, within the proper precinct, at the time of voting... THE voting place has NO way to validate the name or verify the address is even authentic, AND ensure that they have NOT already casted a vote 20-40 times at same or different precinct using a different/invalid address that does not even match the name being presented. AND, ONCE the signature *is separated* from the actual ballot (such as ballot casted inside security envelope that has the signature), you have no means to deal with the fraudulent vote.

It is very interesting that our last National election, showed several abnormal trends with respect to voter "in-person" turn out, that just did not corollate (pass the 'reasonable' test) in several area's when rendered to the power & large scope of Al processing. ---

- 3) LAST MINUTE voter registration removes all safeguards that significantly protects against massive fraudulent voting. That IS sheltered with OREGON mail-in voting. ALL STATES need to recognize the need to better secure their VOTE! Those STATES who DON'T, are truly inviting fraudulent voting for a purpose.
- 4) Current Oregon VOTING, PORTECTS that ONLY those ENTITLED to vote (in Oregon), regardless of their HANDICAP, DISABILITY, even lack of transportation, will NOT be disenfranchised and their VOTE will be counted, in a "FAIR" election.
