SB210

By this testimony, I strongly oppose SB 210. Changing the standard method for conducting an election to in-person voting on election day will lead to voter suppression. This measure will primarily affect working class voters, who will face hardship, inconvenience, and even professional or financial repercussions for choosing to take the time to vote in-person. Additionally, numerous studies (such as on [www.uspis.gov](http://www.uspis.gov)) have shown mail-in ballots are secure, and states with mail-in ballots have consistently shown higher voter participation than states with in-person voting. We must maintain mail-in voting as the standard method in Oregon to ensure equity among all voting groups, since every Oregonian's vote matters.
