I reached out to Secretary of State via email to ask questions about what to do with the ballot and how to remove the person off our state voting registry. They directed me to Washington County Elections. Ultimately I found out the person who left has to complete the cancellation form. I contacted him via Facebook to let him know and gave him link. He acknowledged it and said he would complete later, that was 5/16/24. I don't know if he did or not but still got his general action ballot and I messaged him about it, that was 10/23/24. He has not lived in Oregon for the past 7-8 years, zero reason a ballot should still be sent. It does present opportunity for voter fraud. How many people who leave actually complete that form or even know about it?

As an Oregonian, I would be okay with voting in person as primary way of voting while still have mail in vote with stricter security measure like our state IDs. I would like to see what the rest of our state thinks too, it should be on the ballot. Thank you.
