To restore public trust in our elections, we must return to in-person voting with voter ID requirements and local precinct ballot counting.

Requiring in-person voting strengthens the integrity of our elections by verifying voter identity, reducing the risk of fraud, and keeping the process transparent at the community level.

When we vote in person, we reinforce our shared commitment to democracy and civic engagement. Sending our votes away weakens this connection and reduces the cohesion of our communities.

SB 210 takes a balanced approach by still allowing mail-in voting for military, overseas voters, and those with an out-of-state mailing address while ensuring that the majority of voters participate in person. This is a necessary step to protect fair and free elections in Oregon.

I urge you to pass SB 210 and restore confidence in our electoral process.
