Any measure to make in-person voting on the date of election is a blatant attempt at limiting voting rights of the Electorate and I'm 100% against it. Voting by mail has been demonstrably shown to be safe, reliable, and honest--there is NO evidence that voting by mail increases voter fraud. And allowing a reasonable number of days to count ballots that have been cast by mail--either in early voting or a reasonable number of days AFTER an election to allow for mail delivery to reach ballot counters--has been the Oregon standard and should continue to be so.
