As a citizen of rural Oregon, I strongly oppose this clear attempt at voter suppression. Voting by mail has not been proven to be less secure than any other method, and enables many citizens to vote who otherwise could not. Mail-in voting allows citizens who are disabled, live in a rural area, or are otherwise unable to vote in person to use a constitutional right. Most workplaces do not allow employees to take time off to vote, nor are most employees financially able to afford taking time off to spend a day standing in line, when they may not even get the chance to vote.

These are not speculations but actual problems with in person voting that have been brought up every 4 years. You have a choice to make. Stand up for your citizens, or bow down to whoever threatens them.
