My name is Ana Petras I am the president of the Advocacy For Providers group. I've been an adult foster care home provider for over 24 years. I oppose this bill in its current form. We need a clear understanding of what is considered substantial compliance. WHO will determine that and based on what? It should not be left to the licensors discretion. What I found over the years is that licensors interpret rules with their own understanding. What is significant compliance? One year a licensor found one expired Tylenol during the annual renewal and I contacted hospice in front of her and got a new Tylenol and that's the ONLY finding. The licensor marked off that I was NOT in significant compliance... so my question is... WHO is in significant compliance and based on what? Who will determine that?
