As a registered voter and loyal Oregonian I have an issue with your support of Senate Bill 210.

Because of the decades of evidence in how Oregon matches signatures on file to the ballot envelope there is virtually no chance of any kind of voter fraud be caused.

The number of ballots sent out means nothing if the signature on the envelope does not match the signature on file. Those signatures have been verified because they must be delivered to a county clerk after registering on line. There is a PDF with your data that must be printed, signed and turned in to the County Clerk.

There is only a danger if someone is TRYING to vote for someone else and those instances are very rare.

A review of the vote by mail system? by the state's Legislative Fiscal Office found from 2000-2019 there were approximately 61 million ballots cast. Of those, 38 criminal convictions of voter fraud were obtained. This amounts to a .00006% rate. ?
