I oppose bill 697.

First this already exists in another form:

Oregon Firearm Laws: "In Oregon, the minimum age to purchase a gun varies by type: 21 years old for handguns and 18 years old for rifles and shotguns. In Oregon, it's illegal to sell a gun to a minor.

Many wonder about the legal age for using a firearm in Oregon, which is 18 years old. However, there are exceptions that allow minors to use firearms under specific circumstances, including:

With parental consent, minors may use non-handgun firearms.

Minors can temporarily possess firearms for hunting, target practice, or other lawful purposes.

Handguns may be possessed and used by minors if they are provided by a parent."

*My concern is since voters have no restriction on voting - at age 18, and since 18 year-olds are citizens of the USA, what does this say about our constitution?
