I oppose SB 210 because voting in person will be far more inconvenient than voting by mail. I trust the voting by mail system works just as good as voting in person.

I believe college students will be effectively prohibited from voting because most college students don't change their mailing addresses (and, therefore, voting districts) in this age of electronic mail. With the vote by mail system, parents can either forward their ballots and the voting pamphlet to them or schedule a convenient time for the kids to visit home to vote (which is what we have done).
