It would seem like you've commented that the troubles with 1800 degrees for you is that the crematories are not designed to operate efficiently at such high temperatures, so maybe something like this.

• I fully support the passage of HB-3729. Reducing operating temperatures from 1800F to 1600F for my crematories would be a game changer. It would shorten cremation time, decrease visible emissions (smoke), and lower natural gas consumption at our facilities. Washington State and California are allowed to operate at 1600F, so it doesn't make sense that we are stuck (in the middle) at 1800F, especially with the new understanding about carbon emissions.
