# **Student & Parent Accountability: Attendance**

# Attendance

Schools encourage consistent attendance through a mix of consequences and incentives for both students and parents.

## **Consequences of Poor Attendance**

### **For Students:**

- Loss of privileges (e.g., sports, extracurriculars).
- Academic impact due to missed instruction.
- Detention or required make-up time.
- Truancy referrals or risk of grade retention.

### **For Parents:**

- Mandatory meetings with school officials.
- Fines or legal action in extreme cases. (Only the Legislature has the authority to impose fines/legal action)
- Social service referrals for chronic absenteeism.

# **Incentives for Regular Attendance**

#### For Students:

- Recognition (certificates, awards).
- Rewards (prizes, extra privileges).
- Special events (field trips, celebrations).

# **For Parents:**

- Incentives (fee discounts, gift cards).
- Improved communication and engagement.
- Workplace collaboration to support attendance.
- Access to resources like transportation assistance.

## **Balancing Attendance Measures**

Schools should combine accountability with supportive measures to address barriers while reinforcing attendance through positive reinforcement.

# Student & Parent Accountability: Behavior

## **Behavior**

Schools use structured consequences and incentives to promote responsible behavior and involve parents in the process.

## **Consequences of Poor Behavior**

### **For Students:**

- Verbal warnings and loss of privileges.
- Reflection activities (apology letters, improvement plans).
- Detention, suspension, or expulsion for severe cases.
- Behavior contracts or restorative practices.

#### **For Parents:**

- Required meetings with school staff.
- Referrals to parenting classes or support services.
- Legal action in extreme cases of neglecting responsibilities. (Only the Legislature has the authority to impose fines/legal action)

### **Incentives for Positive Behavior**

### For Students:

- Recognition programs (awards, certificates).
- Privileges (extra recess, leadership roles).
- Token-based reward systems.
- Special events and peer recognition opportunities.

## **For Parents:**

- Positive updates on their child's behavior.
- Rewards and recognition for engaged families.
- Invitations to school celebrations and events.

### **Balancing Behavior Measures**

A positive school culture should emphasize reinforcement over punishment, providing students and parents with the tools to develop and sustain positive habits.
