My name is Kezia Rasmussen and I live in Milwaukie, Oregon.

I am writing to you today in support of SB 80. We must take action to halt the expansion of factory farming, defined by the Oregon Department of Agriculture as large CAFOs, in our state's groundwater management areas until contamination is brought down to safe levels.

Among the environmental and community concerns, I am writing to express interest in preventing the expansion of factory faming in Oregon. Any additional factory farming will dramatically increase the suffering of animals subject to factory farming and I urge you to take a stand in showing the rest of the country that we value respecting the lives of animals here in Oregon. Oregon has progressive, humane values. Yet farmed animals, especially in industrial-scale settings, still suffer immensely as they spend their lives in overcrowded and unsanitary confinement.
