As a City Councilor for the City of Carlton, I am writing to express my strong support for House Bill 3939, which proposes to extend and expand Oregon's residential infrastructure grant program through the Oregon Business Development Department (OBDD).

HB 3939 represents a critical investment in communities like ours that are working to address urgent housing needs. Carlton, like many small cities across Oregon, faces real limitations when it comes to financing the infrastructure necessary to support housing development. This bill directly addresses those limitations.

The proposed allocation of \$1.5 million for the City of Carlton to build a two-part water loop system is particularly meaningful. This infrastructure is not just foundational—it is essential.
