This bill does not serve the people of Oregon—it serves a government agenda to control water, land use, and private property. It would devastate rural communities, farmers, and landowners who depend on wells and septic systems.

I urge you to reject SB 1154 in its entirety. This is a blatant overreach that disregards our constitutional rights and places an unfair financial burden on Oregonians. Our water, our land, and our rights are not for sale.
