I think you may know by now that I am a visual learner. I'm also a visual teacher!

I lean into heckman curve, which is a visual representation of the economic principle that the earlier we invest in our families - in pregnancy, in the first year of a baby's life, the higher the return on that investment.

And you have seen me show the illustration that describes the enormous growth in the human brain in the VERY FIRST year of life.

Heck, I've even promoted a graphic representation of the four squares of my Momnibus policy package, representing supports for housing, poverty mitigation, behavioral heath, and perinatal health.



Still, the following is the ultimate "a picture is worth a thousand words"
