It always has been fully legal and an accept standard practice to allow persons to manufacture firearms for personal use and defense (no defined purpose / ie hunting, sport shooting or defense, existed before the supposed " ghost gun " scary word was created recently. Yet it is now a foundation for this flawed, vague and open explanation of what a firearm frame, or even which receiver actually is addressed. Secondly, this bill has open vague terms like :

Receiver or frame:

when a proportionally large amount of standard production firearms have both an " upper " and " lower " receiver;

In addition, a single frame or unfinished/ partially constructed lock of metal literally not a firearm yet, requires a serial number provided by a system that does not exist, additional officers that may or may not exist, to be completed in a time ' not determined' yet puts 72 hr condition on a person attempting to observe a constitutional right that already exists...

Now restricted to if, when and maybe.

No other constitutional right is held in such contempt or open for discernment.

Therefore it makes a vague discernment and and 1 sided timeline to possible allow a previously acceptable and appropriate constitutional right, while leaving too much if' and maybe' worked in to a condition to misuse, deny and

And delay already protected constitutional rights.
