During this course, the trainers were very receptive to my questions and needs, connecting me with an ASPIRE access specialist. The ASPIRE program has provided invaluable support. The specialist not only guided me with program development but also provided updated resources, staff training, workshops for both students and parents, and financial support. These resources have been crucial in helping me build and strengthen the career and college culture at our school.

One of the most beneficial aspects of working with ASPIRE is the ability to access a wealth of resources without having to spend time navigating them independently. Through the ASPIRE tools and conversations with our specialist, I've been able to create a comprehensive career and college program calendar. This calendar has allowed me to plan and organize career-related learning experiences, classroom engagements, career and college speakers, field trips, and school-wide events. In January, our school moved into a new building, and over the past month, I've focused on creating the ASPIRE Career Center for our students and families. With these funds, we've also been able to support student mock interviews, college field trips, and invite a professional counselor to speak with students on topics related to self-discovery.
