The Oregon Health Authority is not an agency qualified to study existing public policy because the OHA is part of the problem. I note that Oregon State Hospital is under OHA's umbrella and is currently under a contempt order by a federal judge.

I am an absolutist in opposing compulsory "care," especially since the standard of care in modern psychiatry has drifted to provably harmful psychopharmacology. The state's corrupt "Epidemiologist" (who is not an epidemiologist and does not have the educational background to conduct research) intervened and re-wrote the abstract so the report to the legislature state the opposite of what the real researchers actually concluded.

If this legislature really wanted to help Oregonians, it would break up OHA, a corrupt and bloated agency in serious need of reform.
