Measure, Appointment or Topic: SB1154

This is a clear violation of the Fourth Amendment as a citizen's property is sovereign. Without an invitation to step on the property, a warrant, or probable cause the State and any of its agents shall not step foot on said property.

Stepping onto a citizen's property in many cases will be considered a threat, and threats are not taken lightly; especially if the agent of the state has to cross a physical barrier such as a fence to enter said property.

The State has no claim on water they don't transport via dams and canals that they maintain (i.e. a water district).

This measure is a direct infringement of the Supreme Law of the land.
