My name is Bettina Hannigan, and I am honored to represent the Florence Area Chamber of Commerce and the businesses, families, and communities of Florence and the surrounding coastal region.

I am here today to emphasize the critical need for early childhood development centers on the Oregon Coast and to urge you to invest an additional \$500 million in the Employment Related Day Care (ERDC) Program through SB 5514, the Department of Early Learning and Care agency budget.

Strengthen small businesses and our local economy by ensuring employers can maintain a reliable workforce.

Create job opportunities in early childhood education, helping to expand a much-needed workforce.

As a Chamber, we believe that thriving families create thriving communities, and child care is at the very heart of this. We urge you to invest the additional \$500 million into ERDC to ensure that every Oregon family—especially those in underserved rural and coastal areas—has access to quality, affordable child care.
