When I was a kid, I had a job delivering the Oregon Daily Journal to subscribers in my neighborhood. When the Journal was absorbed by the Oregonian, I was out of a job. My father, Bud Kramer, said that the loss of the job was unfortunate, but I should be more concerned about the loss of journalists' voices and a newspaper that covered news differently than the Oregonian. He said that the only way our democracy works is if people have multiple sources for news with different perspectives and rigorous fact-checking.

Profit matters. Whatever the owner's agenda is matters.

We need more voices in journalism. We need independence from corporate owners. I support SB 686.
