I am writing to express Beaverton's support for House Bill 3746, which aims to reform Oregon condominium regulations. This bill is essential for supporting local government housing production strategies, particularly in Beaverton, where there is a clear need for affordable home ownership options to meet the city's housing production goals.

Beaverton's Housing Production Strategy specifically called out the importance of reforming condominium regulations to make them a more feasible option for affordable home ownership. By reducing the statute of limitations for construction defect actions and imposing notice, voting, and approval requirements before homeowners or condominium association owners may bring or join a construction defect action, this bill strikes a good balance between owner protections and developer feasibility. Additionally, the requirement for semiannual moisture inspections by the board of directors of a condominium association ensures that construction quality is maintained.

These measures will help streamline the process and reduce the burden on both owners and developers, making condominium ownership a more attractive and viable option across the state. House Bill 3746 is a crucial step towards achieving Beaverton's housing production goals and I urge you to support this bill and help make affordable home ownership a reality for more residents in our community.
