Studies used to justify such funding are frequently based on self-reported outcomes or mere correlation, not causation, and they conveniently ignore the cities where similar programs have failed.

The vague language in the bill further compounds the issue by creating opportunities for activist groups to obtain funding under the guise of public safety, potentially advancing agendas that have little to do with reducing violence.

Taxpayer dollars should be used responsibly, and that means investing in strategies that are proven, accountable, and focused solely on making communities safer—not in organizations that lack oversight or push political agendas.

I urge you to oppose this bill and instead support data-backed initiatives that prioritize real public safety over ideology.
